Acting Chairman's Report – Sue Atack

T is with very mixed feelings that I sit down to write what will be my last report as Chairman of Broken Rites. It has been an honour and privilege to serve as Chairman over these past three years and before that as Secretary for four years. When I took on the role of Chairman three years ago, as I have said before, I was not sure whether Broken Rites had a future in its existing form. Over these three years the Committee, together with the membership, have discussed and explored whether we are still relevant and needed and the response to this was a resounding 'yes'! However the focus of the help and support needed by clergy spouses/ partners whose marriage/partnership are in crisis has changed from that identified 33 years ago when Broken Rites was formed. Many more clergy spouses/partners are now in employment and have an independent income and social/support network. This means that the social network of local meetings that has been a life line in the past is not as important to many of our new enquirers. However the initial help and information provided by us at the time of crisis is still vital to many of those coming to us for help, as is being able to communicate with others who have experienced a similar crisis - although this now sometimes takes place via our Facebook pages rather than in local social groups. Although the number of enquiries we receive from those looking for our help remains fairly constant, as has been said before the number of those joining Broken Rites continues to decrease. Subsequently our total membership continues to shrink and the number of those from whom we recruit our Links, Area Representatives and Elected and Co-opted Committee members is smaller. This continues to be one of our biggest challenges and we need

to continue to explore different ways of engaging with new members especially those who live in areas where there is no active social group. The committee have agreed to create a new co-opted role of Social Media Co-ordinator, see election and co-option form for details. We hope this role will help Broken Rites to explore the opportunities and potential that the social media now brings and encourage, those for who social media is an integral part of their lives, to engage with us.

During the second half of 2015 the Committee spent time reviewing the role of our Associate Members. The number of associate members has been in decline for probably the last 20 years and we needed to take some action if the role was to continue. As stated in the last edition of Rite Lines we have created a leaflet titled 'Did you know that....' specifically aimed at recruiting new Associate Members and a copy

of this is enclosed with this Annual Report. We are asking all members to endeavour to recruit a minimum of one new Associate Member during 2016. Remember Associate Members have the same voting rights at the AGM as Members and we would welcome active involvement from them, however their prayers and financial support are equally welcomed. One of our longstanding active associate members, Dilys Stone, has agreed to liaise with enquiries from any new potential associate members and can be contacted on associates@brokenrites.org.

A general flyer has also been created that is mainly designed to accompany the Help and Information Pack sent out to initial enquirers. This is headed "Broken Rites", carries the strapline "Here for you, there for others" on the front page, and is designed to give someone a very concise overview of what Broken Rites is. It does not and is not intended to replace the tri-fold leaflet. The Committee felt that as the Help and Information Pack contains lots of detailed information it

would be helpful for new enquirers to be able to see at a glance what help and support Broken Rites can provide. The two leaflets are printed in the Annual Report and we hope that you will extract them and be able to use them.

Both these leaflets are designed to be e-mailed as attachments but can also be printed out in A5 format as and when required. Copies of the general flyer were given out at the Bishop's Visitor AGM last November and feedback from them was that they thought this would be useful to them in their roles.

Lastly we have created a simple 'family tree' diagram to show the structure of Broken Rites. We hope this will be helpful to new and existing members and others in outlining the various roles within our organisation. A copy of this is printed in the annual report for your information.

All of the above and much more could not have been achieved without the hard work and dedication of your Committee. I feel proud of what the Committee has achieved over the years and especially the last few years under my Chairmanship. Chairing committee meetings can sometimes be a challenge as we all have views and opinions we want to express. I have very much enjoyed working alongside my fellow Committee members and thank them all for their support and encouragement. I will miss the laughter and smiles we all enjoy during our meetings but feel that it is time for me to move on. Thank you all for your friendship and I will continue to support Broken Rites and show my face from time to time at future AGMs.

Remember that the date and venue for the 2017 AGM is already confirmed as being held in Edinburgh at the Kirk of the Canongate, on the Royal Mile, on Saturday 29th April 2017. More information about this will be in Rite Lines and many of the Scottish members are happy to provide overnight accommodation. So please put this date in your diaries and enjoy a visit to the beautiful city of Edinburgh.

Broken Rites has established good relationships with the Church Commissioners and supported them in the review of the Value Linked Loan. I sincerely hope this review brings more consistency in the way these loans are granted and administered and I look forward to seeing the final outcome of this process.

Your Committee has been looking at the role and purpose of the Associate Member and the creation of the 'Did you know?' flyer is an excellent development in seeking to grow and widen this role.

This flyer has been designed to encourage the friends and acquaintances of members and church communities to find out more about 'Broken Rites' and how they might provide help and support.

It is important that the whole membership becomes involved in the process to recruit new Associate Members and I wish you every success in this venture.

I hope to join you at your forthcoming AGM on the 16th April.

Website Editor, Enquiries co-ordinator's report and Facebook report

Website Editor's report

2015 has been a relatively quiet year for the web editor. There have been no major changes to the website this year. Items have been updated or added as and when necessary. Do please continue to send me anything which might be of interest to members and also to those who may be looking at the website for the first time. Photos are always welcome as they brighten up the text.

For those of you who are interested in statistics and especially for those of you who wondered why we had so much traffic on our website I have to report that now that our website statistics exclude visits by robots and other automated systems the frequency of visits to the website has fallen to an average of 12 each day, with an average of two pages being looked at on each visit.

Facebook Group report

The secret Facebook group was created shortly before the AGM in 2015. It now has 34 members and is proving to be a valuable addition to the support that we are able to offer. Members must belong to Broken Rites and be invited to join the group by someone who is a member of the Facebook group.

No-one else has access to the page or what is written there. It is a much valued safe space where difficult, painful or confused emotions can be expressed in the knowledge that others will understand and be supportive. As one member said "it is a good place to go at two in the morning when you are feeling overwhelmed by everything". If you like Facebook, do join us. You can do so through your link or rep or by sending in a request through the contact page on the website.

Enquiries co-ordinator's report

As in previous years, the majority of enquiries have come through the website. This year there were 32 in total. Two thirds (twenty) of these were from separated or separating clergy spouses, including one husband of a clergy wife. Whilst each person's situation is unique, one recurring theme this year has been that of emotional abuse within marriage. Those of you who have experienced

this will know how difficult it is, firstly to recognise what is happening, then to stop blaming oneself and finally to take steps to change the situation. The situation is made even more complicated because of the fear that we will not be believed when we do find the courage to talk about what we have experienced.

Of the remaining twelve enquiries, four were straightforward requests for information, two to assist in the update of Diocesan handbooks, one from a newly appointed Bishop's visitor and one from an academic undertaking research on violence in clergy marriages. Some were more complicated. Another Bishop's Visitor was looking for information about provision for a couple separating after retirement. The debate about the nature of Christian marriage led to a number of enquiries. During the year we received two requests for someone to speak on radio programmes.

Despite members being willing to do so at short notice neither was needed as the focus was not on marital breakdown but the theology of marriage. We also heard from the ex-wife of a gay priest incensed about the church's attitude to gay marriage.

The final four enquiries do not fit into any category. There was an enquiry from abroad for help in pursuing a vocation to the priesthood and a clergyman who was wanting support for himself following a separation. The last two enquiries were really positive. One was from a wife who separated ten years ago and wanted to offer to help us and the other was seeking support to nominate someone for an award.

As in previous years I am most grateful to area reps and local links who have always been willing to follow up referrals and make and maintain contact with our enquirers.

Financial Report – 2016

EMBERS will be aware that the mainstay of our annual income is from the subscriptions paid by you. The other main income source is the bi-annual senior church leaders appeal. However both of these income sources do not currently cover the total of our outgoings and have not done so for several years.

In 2015 we had 140 members who should have brought in a total income from subscriptions of around £2,000. At the end of November 2015, 67 members (48%) still had their subscriptions renewal outstanding.

However upon receiving their renewal letters/reminders another 16 members (11%) paid their subscriptions, giving us a year-end total of 63% of paid subscriptions. This means that 37% of subscriptions are still outstanding for 2015 amounting to approximately £750.

We do appreciate that many just forget to send off their cheques and the subscription renewal notice that is sent out with the Annual Report can get buried and forgotten. However we would urge all members to respond to their subscription renewal notice as soon as this arrives on your doorstep. We do need everyone to pay their subscriptions if we are to continue!!

There are a small number of members (4%) who are exempt due to being elderly frail or in extreme financial difficulty and, of course, new members are exempt for their first year. There is also the option to pay a minimum of £2 for those members in financial hardship which we urge you to take up if appropriate to your needs. There are also other members who pay an additional donation to their membership subscription, for which we are extremely grateful.

If you are unsure whether your 2015 subscription is still outstanding please contact Veronica Bale our membership secretary on 01372 721146 or e-mail membership@brokenrites.org. If you pay by standing order please, please check that you have increased this to £15 and that the bank reference gives your name, so we are able to link these from the bank statement to individual members.

REMEMBER if you are not sure please check, we need your support!!!!!! As you know, in accordance with our Constitution, membership termination will be automatic if there has been no renewal of subscription for two consecutive years, so after the third year of non payment. Though we do our best to ascertain why there has been no renewal before doing so.

32nd AGM – My Thoughts

M not quite sure what motivated me to attend the AGM of Broken Rites in April, except for Sue Atack's kind invitation and the prospect of 'a day out'. It didn't take long for me to realise that this bunch was what my life had lacked – a group of people who know just what it's like to be in out special situation.

It brought home to me just what it has been like to feel cast adrift from all the jolly church gatherings of my past, which somehow have eluded me in the two years since the break-up of my 35-year marriage; I've certainly felt like an outsider in these two years.

The thing I most remember about the meeting was the feeling of human warmth in the room; I felt a kind of unspoken understanding and support which I'd not had in a group way, though there have been some individuals doing sterling work to help me. I usually say about such experiences, 'It was like getting into a warm bath'.

My memory isn't great, (so I'll leave others to describe the proceedings of the meeting in more detail) — perhaps this is something to do with trauma — and I rather remember the effects of the things that happen to me, and the effect of this gathering was to make me realise that my feelings of being still unsettled and 'not quite right yet' were really quite to be expected, and thus, happily, I might expect further progress—I won't have to settle for this feeling of being in a kind of half-life forever.

Perhaps in time, I could become one of these vibrant people, and to try to make wounds to heal too quickly might only lead to a kind of infection being trapped in the system.

As I write, I'm trying to arrange for myself a new home, back in the diocese I left, and it's stirring up some mud at the bottom of the murky pond that is my emotional life. It's frankly scary, as I try to answer the question 'Where is home?' that I'd been asking for some time before the break-up.

Perhaps one day I'll be able to become one of the cheerful ones and be aware of what I've gained as well as what I have lost.

Being a coffee addict in the mornings, I was a bit disconcerted at the lack of hot drinks, but I DID have to giggle at the idea of Church House, the very epicentre of the C of E, banning the use of the kitchen to a bunch of ex-vicar's wives!

Next time, like the wise virgins, I'll bring a flask!"
